Courthouse

200 Court Square; Downtown Newnan

In 1904, the former 75 year old courthouse was razed and replaced by the one which stands today. James Golucke, who designed several other courthouses in Georgia , was the architect, and R.D. Cole was the contractor. The cost was \$58,000. The courthouse is an excellent example of Neo-Greek Revival architecture, with stamped and formed copper cornices and pediments. The dome rises more than 100 feet and features clocks on all four sides, and a bell in the tower still chimes each hour. Most court functions moved to the Coweta County Justice Center in 2006, but a redevelopment plan was designed for the Courthouse by a Citizen's Committee to ensure the courthouse continues to be a vital part of government, the community, and downtown Newnan.
